

Risk-Avert is an award winning and independently evaluated early intervention programme. It is delivered by schools and is primarily focused on year 8 pupils.

This academic year marks 10 years since the Risk-Avert programme was first launched in Essex.

From our original pilot of 8 schools in 2013 the programme has grown significantly and now offers services to schools across the UK.

To mark this landmark we have produced the infographic on the next page which highlights some statistics which demonstrate the significant reach of the intervention over the past 10 years.

10 Years of Risk-Avert

46,343 young people in year 8 have completed our survey.



8,000 young people have been identified for the programme.



We've worked with **139** secondary schools across the UK.

Across Essex, Southend and Thurrock we have worked with **94 (75%)** secondary Schools and **208 (51%)** primary Schools.



We've trained over **500** professionals from secondary schools to deliver the programme.



We've delivered the programme in **11** local authority areas with **3** more looking to join next year.

Academics from **3** universities have proven the effectiveness of the programme.



75% of participating young people have seen improvements in well-being, **73%** in self efficacy and **73%** in resilience.
