# How Risk-Avert works for your school

### **Risk-Avert involves:**

- training and ongoing support to empower teachers to deliver sessions in their own schools
- online surveys to create individual risk profiles to identify vulnerable pupils
- complete RSHE scheme of work and online resources including lesson plans, videos , PowerPoint presentations and factsheets
- evaluation reporting to measure impact and effectiveness.

### Primary Schools

Risk-Avert Primary helps prepare Year 6 pupils for the transition to Secondary School.

Four sessions for targeted groups or whole class, focused on what safety feels like, protective behaviours for personal safety, how we can identify risk and what practical steps we can to minimise and manage risky situations.

**Tailored online resources** to support delivery of the four sessions and a **RSHE** scheme of work to support whole school approaches.

### Year 8 (Recommended)

**Training** to support an unlimited number of staff.

**Online survey** to create risk profiles for individual pupils, access to online resources, on-going teacher support and evaluation as standard.

#### Six session intervention

for pupils vulnerable to multiple risk-taking behaviours (identified through survey).

Additional Support Programmes – Schools also have access to emotional health and RSE interventions as standard.

### Secondary Schools – PSHE Support

**Unlimited access** to online resources and scheme of work to meet statutory **RSHE** requirements.

#### Plus – optional

- unique school survey links for each year group
- training for an unlimited number of staff.

# Helping children and young people to understand and manage risk

Risk-Avert is an early intervention and prevention approach, designed and developed by The Training Effect – a leading provider of award-winning health-based interventions for children and young people, and originally commissioned by Essex County Council.

The programme supports children and young people aged 9 - 18 to make positive choices that can help them navigate life and avoid situations and behaviours that may be harmful to their health or well-being.

Understanding development of the teenage brain and how young people make decisions is key to helping them to better manage risk. Whilst positive risk-taking is essential to healthy development, Risk-Avert explores ways of helping young people to develop the skills which allow them to identify, understand and manage negative risk-taking.
